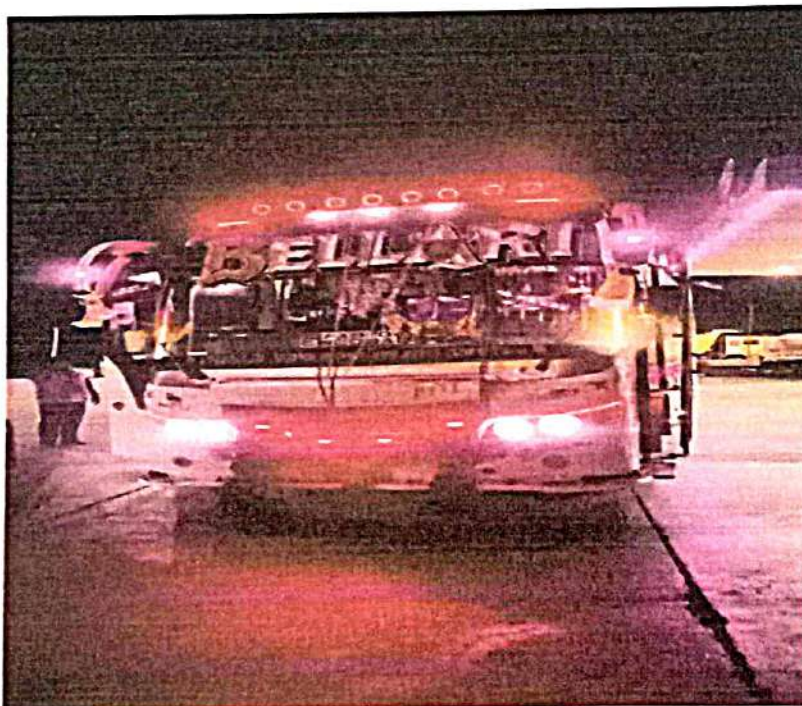



The study tour provided an immersive educational experience for the students and teachers to impart training in education through purposeful recreation, sightseeing and discussion in different places and atmosphere.

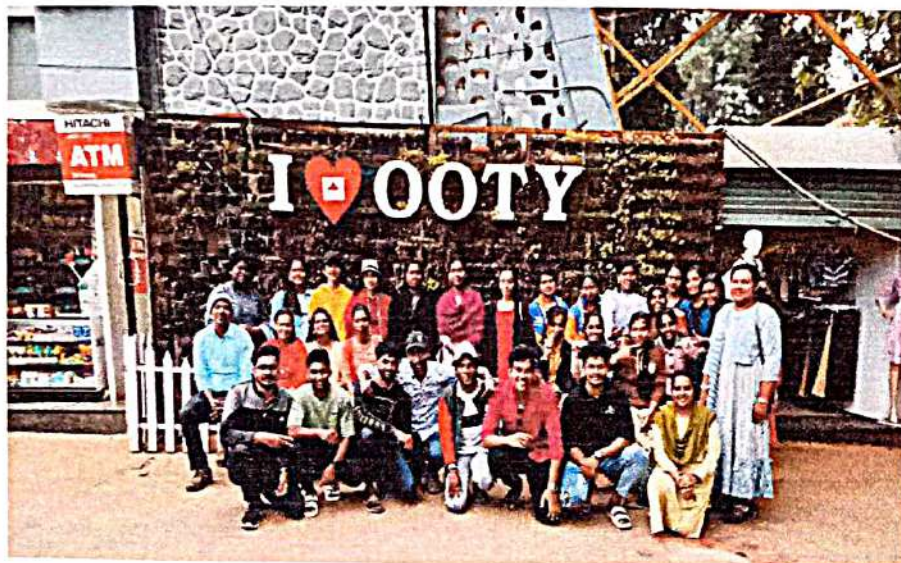

There each stage of tea production like withering, rolling, drying, and finally, the shifting stages and the chocolate production process consists of fermentation, drying, roasting, grinding of cocoa beans, mixing of all ingredients (cocoa mass, sugar, cocoa butter, emulsifiers, aroma, and milk components if needed), conching, and tempering.



Next we visited Ooty lake and enjoyed boating. At 1 pm we had lunch. Then we moved to the Pine forest. Pine forest is one of the prime places to visit in Ooty. It is known for its scenic beauty and tranquility. Next, we visited Botanical Garden. The stretched green land showcases thousands of exotic and indigenous florals, making it an ideal place for the nature lovers. The day ended joyfully, by singing and dancing around the campfire.

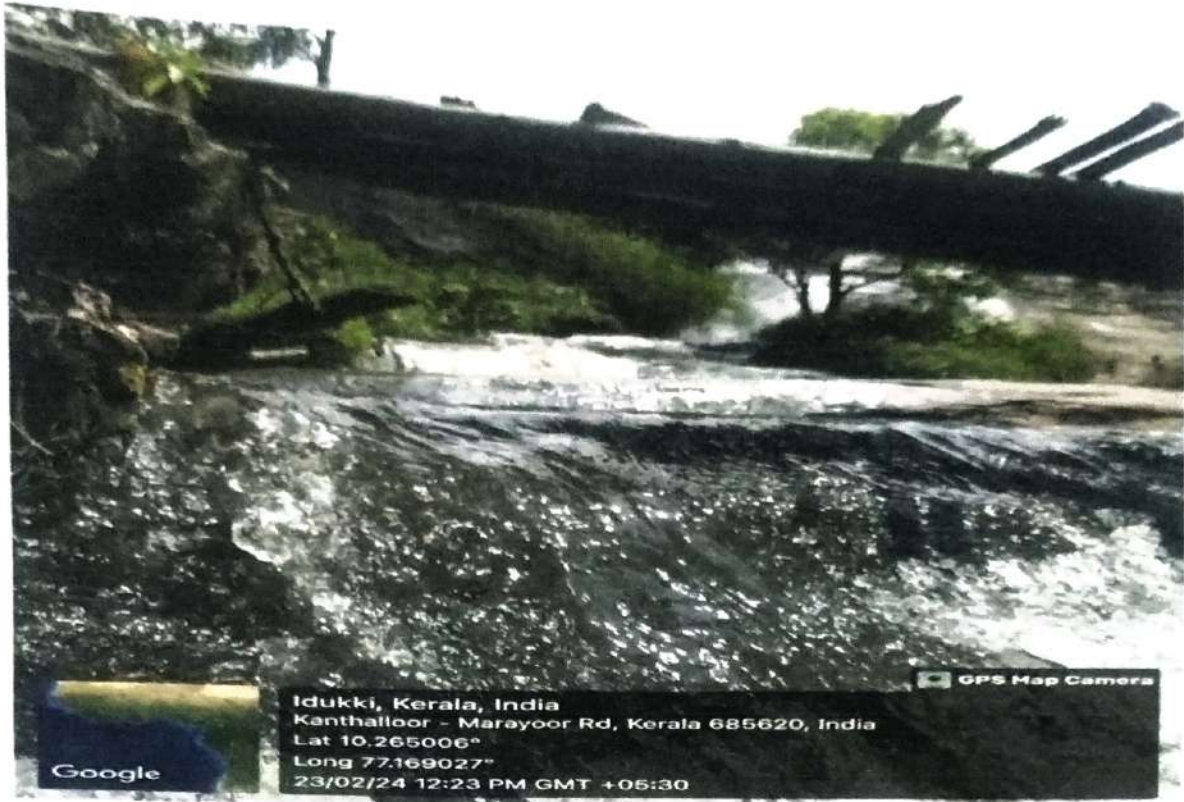

Introduction:

A study tour is a part and parcel of the field work training in social work education. It is compulsory for final year students as a part of social work training. Study tour helps and encourages students to understand the realities in society. Both sociological and social work aspects must be covered as far as possible. We organized important institutional visit, ideal villages or community development projects, government and non government funding agencies, slum, and psychiatric hospitals were also included in our visit. Besides this creation of general relevant ideas were also included like social cultural changes in the places / regions exchange of ideas and a clear exposure to group life was provided.

Objectives of study tour:

- To provide an opportunity to the students to have a group experience to express their views and to exchange ideas and concepts regarding social aspects and social life.
- To provide an opportunity to study the socio-cultural changes, values, social practice and Phenomena in different parts of the country.
- To enable the students to meet eminent personalities in the field of social work to interact with them to get experiences.
- To study different ideal of social development sources of national and international funds, methods and techniques skills used by the people in implementing different type of projects.

- To enable students to visit ideal village communities development project social welfare Organizations, social institutions, so that they can learn the relevant methods, techniquesAnd skills.
- To understand the procedures and methods followed in different kinds of funding agencies in different parts of the country.



- To observe and collect information from various sources etc.

Students should use the following techniques to collect information from the places which are to be visited.

1. Observation and discussions.
2. Interactions and collections.
3. Documentation and recording.
4. Photographs

Participants of the tour:

12 MSW students and 2 faculty members Mrs. S Mary Pelsit, Head of the department and Mr. Salu John Assistant professor of social work department.

Pre Tour Planning:

The trainee conducted different meetings to discuss about the study tour. After the long discussion and meeting, the trainees decided to conduct study tour to Mumbai, Pune for ten days from October 1st to 10th October 2023. It was accepted by the department faculty members and principal of the college. Various committees were formed to maintain the study tour in a successful way. Mr. Jofin Joseph was selected as the tour co-coordinator and Ms. Jeflin D as the Asst. coordinator. The train travel arrangements and booking tickets were done by Mr. Adhrish Joseph. The accommodation at Mumbai, was arranged by Mrs. Mary Pelsit (Head of the dept.).

Mainly the trainees planned to visit Sion Hospital, Daravi slum, Mazagon Dock Shipyard Ltd, TATA Institute of social science in Mumbai, Redstreet, Chaithanya Hospital and Sasoon hospital in Pune.

Day 1

On day 1, which was on 1/10/2023, social work trainees arrived at Trivandrum Railway Station at 8:30 am. Our journey started at 9:15 am, and trainees were accompanied by 12 students and 2 faculty members. Trainees reached Lokmanya Railway Station on 2/10/2023 at 5:30 pm. After that, trainees reached our staying place, which is opposite to Kamaraj School on 90 Feet Road, Chawal, Dharavi, at 6:30 pm. Trainees had our refreshment from 6:30 to 7:30 pm, followed by dinner at 7:30 pm. At 8:00 pm, trainees had a group discussion, and everyone went to bed by 9:30 pm.

Day 2

The second day of the study tour began by 8:00 am. The group had their breakfast after getting the instructions from the tour coordinator at 8:45 am. Then the group departed from the staying place to Lokmanya Tilak Municipality General Hospital, Sion at Mumbai, and arrived at 10:00 am. Social work department in Sion hospital was established in 1956. The orientation was

given by Mr. Prakash (Community Development Officer) and Mrs Smitha, Psychiatric counselor. The main activity of social work department was presented through documentation by Mr.Prakash. There are eight community development officers are working under social work department, then the students visited those officers and interacted with them. This hospital at a unique situation and is the first major referral hospital and caters to all trauma and disasters from both major highways. Started as a fifty bedded hospital and single OPD, it has grown to more than 2000 beds and planning to expand over few years more rapidly. Currently with 300 senior staff members and 550 postgraduate students, it takes care of around 16 lakhs OPD patients and more than 90000 admissions per year. It provides services in all specialties and many super-specialties. With Many Intensive care units and special clinics, it takes care of complex health problems at very affordable cost. It has special clinics on Learning disability. Hemato-oncology, Thalassemia and Stem cell therapy. Over last 65 years it is offering services to the under privileged sections of the society. The main strength of Lokmanya Tilak Municipal General Hospital has been the efficient Trauma Care Centre and emergency Medical services centre with the state-of-the- art equipment and facilities. It was the first Trauma Service in our country and possibly in Asia, which has been on a constant 'state of alert' for disasters. This hospital is a nodal centre amongst the medical services of the Disaster management plan in the civic context. It has many firsts to its credit like human milk bank, skin bank and first emergency coronary stenting. Social work department plays a major role in the side of poor patients, medical expense. If a particular patient is financially weak he/she can enrol their name in social work department, so that the members from the social work department will collect the neat evidence and then they will refer for the sponsors for their financial help. Expensive treatments will be also reduced in to a simple amount.

Sion Hospital in Mumbai has a strong commitment to corporate social responsibility (CSR). They organize various community outreach programs, such as free medical camps, where they provide essential healthcare services to those in need. Additionally, they conduct health education sessions to raise awareness about important health issues. Sion Hospital also extends support to underprivileged individuals by offering financial assistance for medical treatments. Their CSR activities aim to improve healthcare access and promote the overall well-being of the community.

Vote of thanks was proposed by Mrs. Lekshmi santhosh at the end of the session. After that the group had lunch at 1:30pm and departed at 2:00pm.





At 2:30pm the group attended the orientation programme by Mrs. Archana (faculty member of social work). The Tata Institute of Social Science (TISS) is a multi-camps public funded research university in Mumbai, India, TISS is Asia's oldest institute for professional social work education and was founded in 1936 in the Bombay Presidency of British India as the Sir Dorabji Tata Graduation School of Social Work by the Sir Darabji Tata Trust. In 1944, the institution was officially renamed as the Fata Institute of Social Science and in 1967; the government of India declared TISS as Deemed University under section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act 1956. The social work department has 9 specializations Around 400 faculty members are working under this university and 42 faculties are from Social Work Department. TISS's academic programs focus on the Social science and offers doctoral degrees in Management and Labor studies, Disaster Studies, development Studies, Education, Gender Studies, Health Studies, Law, Media and Cultural Studies, Public Policy, Rural Development and social Work, Since its inception TISS had focused on Field action including in responding to disasters such as

the Partition of India, the Bhopal Disaster and Uttarkhand Flood. In the end of orientation there



was a interaction session between Mrs.Sharon and the student trainees. More questions were arising from the side of students and it was clearly explained by Mrs. Sharon. Then the orientation was completed with the vote of thanks by Ms. Anju A. S

Next the group visited Sir Dorabji Library, TISS Library was established along with the institute in 1936, is one of the leading social science libraries in the country. The library was named as “Sir Dorabji Tata Memorial Library” on 3 May 2002 in the memory of late Sir Dorabji Tata. Indian Library Association conferred the library with L. M. Padhya Best University Library Award in 2008. Currently, the library about 123,000 books and 10,298 journals in principle domains of social sciences. The library also operates centre with assistive technologies “M K Tata Centre for the Visually Challenged and a cyber library which provides computers and internet to the students from economically weaker sections. The library has established national and international collaborations including London School Of Economics Library, Mahasarakham University, International Federation of Library Association. Special library for MPhil and PhD scholars.

Day 3

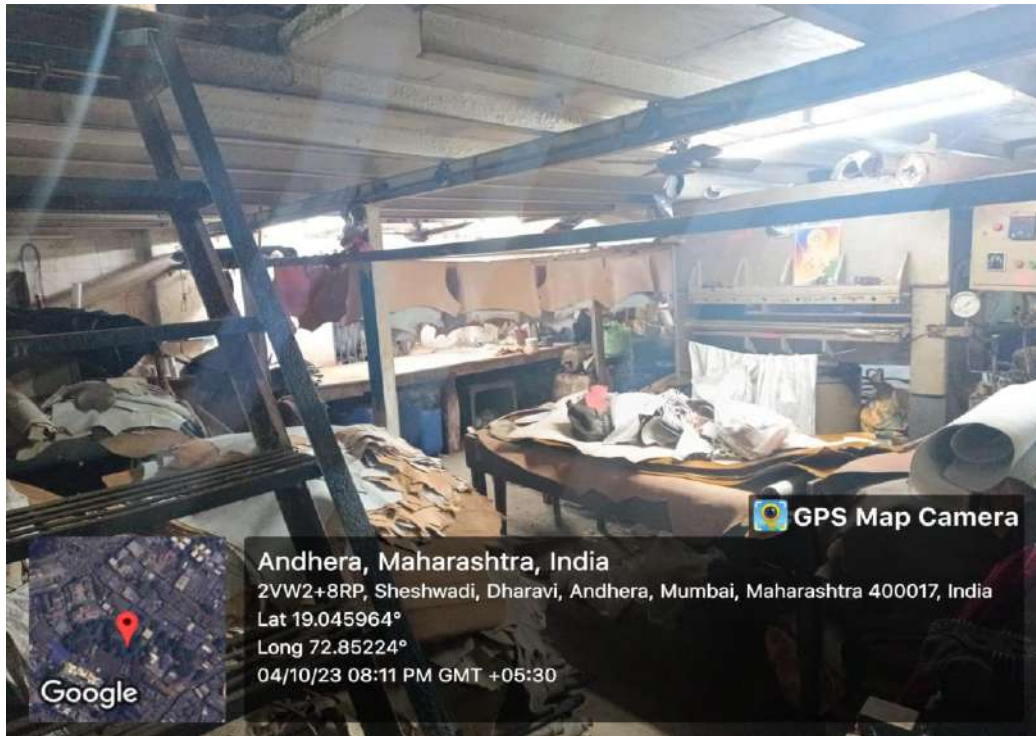
Trainee woke up at 6:00 am and had some refreshment and breakfast at 8:30 am. Trainee started our travel at 9:00 am and reached the industry at 9:45 am. Trainee had to wait for permission until 10:30 am. Then, trainee visited the Mazagon shipyard and explored different parts of the ship-making areas. Trainee also visited the HR department and interacted with the team. Mr. Prasanth explained the history of the shipyard, and the welfare officer, Mr. Nishanth, shared information about the schemes, acts, and other measures taken in the company. Trainee had lunch at 1:30 pm, and the visit was completed at 2:00 pm. After that, trainee returned to our staying place at 3:00 pm. In the evening, at 6:00 pm, trainee attended the evaluation session



where each trainee shared their own experiences from the day.

At 6:30 PM, trainee had a refreshment. At 7 PM, trainee visited the Dharavi slum area. During the visit, our group explored various types of manufacturing and cottage industries. Trainee had dinner at 8:30 PM, followed by another round of refreshment. We went to bed at 10:00 PM.”

Day 4

The fourth day of study tour started with prayer at 7:00am and had breakfast at 8:30am. The group departed from the staying place to Gateway of India, Mumbai. The Gateway of India is an arch-monument built in the early twentieth-century located in the city of Mumbai, in the Indian state of Maharashtra. It was erected to commemorate the landing of the first British monarch in India, King-Emperor George V and Queen-Empress Mary's arrival at Apollo Bunder, Mumbai (then Bombay) in December 1911. Built in the Indo-Saracenic style, incorporating elements of 16th-century Gujarati architecture, the foundation stone for the gateway was laid in March 1913. During the royal visit, the gateway was not yet built and a cardboard structure had greeted the monarch. The final design of the monument by architect George Witter was sanctioned only in 1914, and construction was completed in 1924. The structure is a triumphal arch made of basalt, which is 26 meters (85) feet high.





Then trainee go shopping on Fashion Street from 11:00 am to 1:30 pm. Visit the Hanging Garden. The Hanging Gardens, also known as Pherozeshah Mehta Gardens, is a beautiful park located in Mumbai. It was built in the late 19th century and is perched on the slopes of Malabar Hill. The garden offers stunning views of the Arabian Sea and the city skyline. It is adorned with lush greenery, colorful flowers, and well-manicured lawns. The park is a popular spot for locals and tourists alike to relax, take a leisurely stroll, and enjoy the serene ambiance. Trainee had lunch at 2:30 pm. Return to the staying place at 3:30 pm for refreshment and check out of the room at 6:30 pm. Head to the railway station and catch the train at 8:20 pm, go for Pune.

Day 5

Then the group visited Chaitanya Institution for Mental Health at 10:00am and attended orientation class by Mr. Anto Augustine (co-ordinator). Chaitanya Institute for Mental Health is one of the leading Residential Psychiatric Care Centers in western region of India, Established for the acute management and community based psycho social rehabilitation of the mentally ill. Currently Chaitanya provides residential care facilities for patients suffering from various psychiatric disorders such as Schizophrenia, Mood disorders, Personality disorders, Substance

related disorders and Geriatric disorders. In reality, Mental illness accounts for five or ten leading causes of distress and disability in Asia. Although there are various types of mental disorders, schizophrenia which is characterized by abnormalities in the perception or expression of reality has 1% of the general population affected. Substance Abuse is another major cause of suffering in this world and those with dual diagnosis are even more personified dilemma. Psychological Evaluation, Diagnosis and Acute Care treatment needs to be followed up with Rehabilitation for a better success rate. This gives the patient space to restructure their lives and to gain more insight into their illness, besides giving temporary respite to the Caregiver.

The Family Counseling Centre at Chaitanya Mental Health Centre in Pune is a valuable resource for individuals and families seeking support for their mental health and well-being. The centre offers counseling services specifically tailored to address the unique challenges faced by families. They provide a safe and confidential space for families to discuss their concerns, improve communication, and strengthen relationships. The Community Development Office at Chaitanya Mental Health Centre in Pune plays a vital role in promoting mental health awareness and providing support to the community. They also provide resources and referrals to individuals seeking mental health services. The Community Development Office at Chaitanya Mental Health Centre is dedicated to creating a supportive and inclusive community where mental health is prioritized and individuals can access the help they need.



Goal and Objectives:

CIMH's ultimate goal is to reintegrate the chronic, mentally ill back into their families and society. Towards this achievement, Chaitanya works on specific objectives like-

- Providing Psychosocial Rehabilitation services to the individuals suffering from mental illness.
- Promoting Mental Health and creating Awareness about mental illness in the community.

Networking with other organizations working in the field of Mental Health.

Then he explained about the services provided were comprehensive Rehabilitation, bio- psychosocial services are always in coordination with various professionals, for the treatment and Rehabilitation of individuals affected with chronic Mental Illness and Substance Dependence. Chaitanya requires Psychiatric Social Workers, Doctors, Nurses and other Staff Assistants like home nurses, etc. Then the session was concluded with the vote of thanks by Mr. Subin Geo Thomas. Later, the group visited different wards which are planned for the patients with different disorder.



Evaluation session

All the social work trainees gathered in a hall for the evaluation session. Each trainee shared their point of merits and demerits. Particularly every trainee and the staff mentioned about the time delay. So the time keeping committee apologized everyone to manage the time in a proper way.

Day 6

The trainee wakes up at 7:00 am, refreshes, and eats breakfast at 8:00 am. Then, the trainee goes to Sassoon Hospital at 9:30 am. The interaction session starts at 10:30 am with Mr. Monish, who explains organ transplantation and donation. In 1924, Gandhi was admitted to the hospital in the Speciality department. The Medical Social Work Department at Sassoon Hospital provides crucial support and assistance to patients and their families. They offer various services, such as counseling, referrals to community resources, and assistance with discharge planning. Their activities include conducting psychosocial assessments, facilitating support groups, and advocating for the needs of patients. Currently, Sassoon Hospital has around 1,300 beds, which



is a large capacity.

During the visit to Sassoon Hospital, trainees had the opportunity to explore the Medical Social Work Department. This department plays a crucial role in providing support to patients and their families. They offer various services, such as counseling sessions to help patients cope with their medical conditions and emotional challenges.
